Support is provided by an Early Intervention Consultant who has specialist training in working with children who have developmental or sensory issues.

Sessions are weekly for 10 weeks.

Goals of the Program

Children will:

 become aware of body signals and be better able to self-regulate.

Families will:

 learn to decode their child's behaviour and identify sensory triggers.
